- 1. Ladies gathered for Annual General Meeting.
- 2. MaryAnn Bachelu said Grace and dinner was served at 6:00 pm.
- **3.** Val Bailey called the meeting to order at 6:45 pm.
- **4. Approval of Agenda** A question was raised by Del Robinson regarding the clarity of Recruitment of Officers Val advised it should be the Executive and Committee Members. Carol Michel approved the agenda, seconded by Jeanniene Kanciruk.
- **5. Approval of Minutes of September 27, 2022 –** will be completed at the Executive meeting on May 15, 2023.
- **6. President's Report** Val welcomed the ladies to the 2023 golf season with the Tor Hill Ladies Club. She welcomed all the new members asking them to stand and be recognized. She thanks Linda Reakes and Joanne Merk for maintaining and updating the website and encouraged everyone to review the rules and pace of play.
- **7. Treasurer's Report** Wendy Uytterhagen reviewed the 2023 Tor Hill Ladies Budget. She spoke to the membership fees being raised to \$80.00 for the year due to Golf Canada fee increase, PST being now charged on full amount, prizes and admin costs rising. We do have a healthy budget for the upcoming year.

- **8. Handicap Report** Janice Pointer introduced herself as the Afternoon contact and Elly Blackstock as the Morning contact. She advised all members will be renewed for the new season with Golf Canada and a reminder to enter all scores, good and bad into Golf Canada. The preferred method is hole by hole. - 9. Tournament Committee Anita Ford advised that she and Jeanniene Kanciruk are happy to be your new Tournament Chairs. They will be in charge of the Pro Lady and Rose Bowl in addition to all other regular tournaments the club puts on. May 9<sup>th</sup> was the original qualifier date for the Pro Lady but due to weather it will be changed to May 16<sup>th</sup>, second qualifier date will be May 30<sup>th</sup>. Anyone interested in trying for the team needs to enter by May 16<sup>th</sup> at the latest. The Pro Lady will be held June 5<sup>th</sup> at the Wascana. Evan Lang, our Pro, will be attending and with him will be our Club Champion, Karen Mario plus two available spots.

10. Captain's Reports – Joanne Merk, Morning Captain spoke to the passing of one of our long time members, Lynne Switzer-Geesen. Joanne introduced Helen Burgess as the Morning Assistant Captain. There will be some changes this year. The recording of your accomplishments such as birdies, chip-ins and cancellation dates will be online.
