4. President's Report

Val thanked the outgoing Executive - Janice Pointer, Afternoon Handicap; Lorna Dopson and Sheena Walker, Prize Committee; Del Robinson, Afternoon Captain; Wendy Uytterhagen, Treasurer; Mariann Rasmussen, Past President. She also wanted to welcome whoever was new to the Executive team. Val also thanked Evan Lang and his staff in the Pro Shop for their kindness and accommodating the Ladies Club to keep a good relationship with Western Golf Management.

The Map Grant was successful again this year. We were able to send a team of 3 ladies to the Pro Lady, a team to the Rose Bowl and a team of 4 ladies to the Interclub. She recommends if lessons are offered next year, they be at a reduced rate. Hopefully we can send two teams to the Rose Bowl.

6. Committee Reports

Handicap – Elly Blackstock

Elly said her role is to help members to obtain and maintain an accurate Handicap Index. The Handicap Index ensures each member can equally compete in all types of fun games and competitions within the club and outside the club. Some stats of the Morning Section scores entered show that on average 75% of members entered their scores this past season.

An established Handicap Index is a requirement to play in the fun games the Captains organize throughout the year. An established Handicap Index is also a requirement to play in any of the tournaments run by the Tournament Committee. This year she performed audits on scores entered for Tuesday's games. Any questions on scoring was brought to each member's attention on a case-by-case basis. This year she provided assistance to members when the audits showed:

- the Yellow/White Hybrid tee box was selected versus the Forward(Yellow) tee box
- a different group of courses was selected than what the Tuesday draw indicated
- plus, a few other one off situations

Although there is no longer a formal award for the most improved golfer Del would like to acknowledge that over 20 members have improved their handicap this season.

I is for "Initiatives"

This season we incorporated some new initiatives – primarily based on suggestions from the fall 2022 survey and also based on opportunities to streamline and improve processes.

Thanks again to members who participated in last fall's survey. Del appreciated all of the suggestions and would like to acknowledge and compliment Vicky Hammer who submitted two great ideas. One of her suggestions was to occasionally blend the afternoon participants and the "Mix and Mingle" was introduced to the Afternoon ladies. It was so well received it was incorporated as a full club event. Golfers had an opportunity to play with other club golfers and socialize following golf with games and treats.

Vicky's second recommendation was to provide clarity about the Tuesday events. Del incorporated a summary of events that included a detailed description and objective of the event, indicated how scores were calculated, what golfers needed to do and additional comments about this event. This great idea was beneficial to all members and especially for new members.

Another initiative worth noting – that streamlined scoring was having members complete their own event scoring for the last two-thirds of the season. Now it takes 5 minutes to do the scoring thanks to the members who adopted this approach.

Del incorporated "Fairway Fortunes" into our communication to celebrate and acknowledge accomplishments this season.

The most rewarding initiatives this season were additional charitable contributions and donations. This year we collected books for the Pasqua Hospital Auxiliary as well as collected tabs from cans turning "Silver into Gold" in support of helping kids with cancer and childhood cancer awareness.

Based on scores that were entered into Golf Canada - since the beginning of May until September 24th the afternoon golfers recorded a total of 1,581 games. Vicky Hammer and Pat Scrimbitt exceeded 70 rounds of golf! Three afternoon members played more than 60 games. And 7 golfers play more than 50 rounds!

Within the 1,581 games there were: 2,066 pars and 6,622 bogeys.

<u>The second "L" is for "Laughter"</u>. We've had plenty of fun this season and experienced a lot of great belly laughs! Hearing the laughter in the clubhouse after a round of golf is a reminder of why we all enjoy golfing at Tor Hill!

Tournament Committee - Anita Ford, Jeanniene Kanciruk

Tee at Tor Open Tournament was held on Thursday, July 6 with 84 golfers which was up from last year. The entry fee remained the same as the previous year at \$90.00 per person. The proceeds from the Raffles and 50/50 went to the Regina Transition House.

This year the **Club Championship** was held on Monday, August 21 and Tuesday, August 22 with 52 golfers. There were three divisions; Amateur, Senior 60+ and Masters 70+ with four flights. And finally, we want t pass along a very Big Thank You to those who volunteered and assisted the Tournament Committee during gathering year with the tabulation of the results and other duties.
